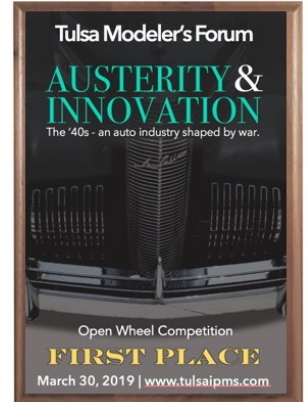


Welcome to the Tulsa Modeler's Forum 2019 Contest and Show!

We have two themes this year: **Normandy Remembered – From D-Day to Paris**, and for our auto enthusiasts, **Austerity & Innovation – The 40's: an auto industry shaped by war**. We've also added a host of new awards, including a new Superdetailing award. See the contest flyer and the Best Superdetailing Entry Supplement for details

The registration instructions are on the Contest Entry Form, and if you follow them fully and complete them in advance, the registration process will go much faster for everyone! If you download the PDFs of the forms in advance, you can fill them out online before you print (and it's much easier to read than your handwriting!)



Please feel free to download the **Judging Criteria** we use (see the Contest Page on our site). We use a different judging method than most contests, in that we use a numerical scoring system, so that each entry is judged solely on the basis of the criteria and the points scale, rather than as a straight comparison against other entries. It takes more effort to judge this way, but we believe it is more fair in outcome. And because we post the scoring results online, you can see how the judges rated you in the three areas of criteria. The same panel of judges score all of the entries in each overall category (Aircraft, Auto, etc.) so that the scoring scale remains consistent within each category.

Several weeks after the contest, you can go to the contest page on our website and review the results and also the scores of every entry.

CATEGORY SPLITS

Categories can be split at the discretion of the Judging Committee while the contest is in progress, in order to better balance the composition of the categories. In general, categories would be split according to the following guidelines:

For the new category, there must be three or more entries by at least two different modelers. The original category from which these models are removed still needs to contain a minimum of three entries by at least two different modelers.

Automobile Categories Details

Box Stock: Model must be built using only the parts that came in the box with the exception of filler material, paint and foil. Instructions must accompany the model.

Factory Stock: Any vehicle built as it came from the factory.

Street Rod: Pre-1949 street-legal vehicles that have been primarily mechanically modified for increased performance.

Street Machine: Same as Street Rod, except 1949 and newer.

Light Commercial: Cars, pickups, SUV's, vans, sedan and panel deliveries and vehicles based on them that are used for business purposes with 1-ton or less capacity. Shall have appropriate markings and ready for work. Includes small emergency vehicles (i.e. police car).

Heavy Commercial: Service vehicles such as tractor-trailers, large straight trucks, busses, construction, fire & rescue & others with over 1-ton capacity. Shall have appropriate markings. Includes large emergency vehicles (i.e. fire truck or police armored car).

Custom: Any car, SUV, pickup, sedan or panel delivery etc., that has major body modifications so that it is no longer stock in appearance. Vehicle does not have to be street legal. Factory concept or experimental cars will be included in this class.

Open Wheel Competition: Any closed-course competition vehicle with exposed wheels (no fenders) designed and built to compete on a paved or dirt track or off-road. (Indy, CART, Formula 1, sprint cars, etc.).

Closed Wheel Competition: Any closed-course competition vehicle with covered wheels (inside fenders) designed and built to compete on a paved or dirt track or off-road (NASCAR, IMSA, Can Am, Trans Am, etc.).

Motorcycles: Civilian/racing only.

Superdetailing Award Qualification/Description (more details on the entry forms):

This prize is to award extra work done on any kit that involves the **significant** conversion, modification or detailing of the basic kit. Special weight is given to the use of "**raw materials**," such as sheet and rod styrene, wire, sculpted putty, etc. Such work can be combined with the use of aftermarket accessories such as resin or metal parts, photoetch, or 3D printed parts or parts from other kits (kit-bashing) for the overall project, but the **emphasis is on the use of raw materials and overall creativity**. The judges will focus on the effort involved, and how much the work adds to the overall quality and creativity of the model.

Contest Entry Form

To make registration smooth and fast, please read carefully and complete your model entry forms and registration process properly.

1. Complete the **Contest Entry Sheet** (this page) including check box for junior if applicable.
2. Complete a **Model Entry Form** (both Display Section & Judging Form) for each model
3. Check applicable boxes on the **Judging Form** for **Junior**, **Theme(s)** or **Superdetailing** entries
4. Bring the completed forms to **Cashier** to pay for registration and receive PAID stamp.
5. Bring the STAMPED forms to the **Registration** table.
6. Take both sections of the **Model Entry Form** and your model, and place on the table in the appropriate section – category numbers and descriptions are on the table tents.
7. Place the model entry forms **BESIDE** the model, **NOT UNDER IT**.

Best Superdetailing Entry Supplement

Qualification/Description:

This prize is to award extra work done on any kit that involves the **significant** conversion, modification or detailing of the basic kit. Special weight is given to the use of "**raw materials**," such as sheet and rod styrene, wire, sculpted putty, etc. Such work can be combined with the use of aftermarket accessories such as resin or metal parts, photoetch, or 3D printed parts or parts from other kits (kit-bashing) for the overall project, but the **emphasis is on the use of raw materials and overall creativity**. The judges will focus on the effort involved, and how much the work adds to the overall quality and creativity of the model. **One notable exclusion: Dioramas will not be considered** for this award, as by their nature there is a lot of scratch building and super detailing involved.

Examples:

Sanding off raised detail and re-scribing/riveting. Creating wiring or tubing. Interior details (switches, levels, dials, upholstery). Opening access panels or doors, cutting free control surfaces. Replacing parts with resin, vac form, 3D printed or scratch built options. Drilling openings (gun barrels, vents, etc.). Creating surface texture (zimmerit, fabric, etc.). Adding details (aerials, static wicks, vents, knobs). Adding in-context items (tools, cargo, random clutter).

Entry:

1. Use the checkbox on the model entry form to call out that your model qualifies for this prize.
2. Fill out the section below that details ALL of the extra work done on the model beyond what was in the box. Put the detail work on the left, and note materials/products used on the right. **(Use reverse side if needed) Pictures help!!**
3. At the registration table, present this sheet to be cut so that the detail description can be placed with the model for the judges to see.
