
Dave O'Sullivan brought in two 1/72 scale German armor kits from Dragon, a King Tiger and a Jagtiger, both beautifully built and painted.


Jim's contribution this evening was a Formula 1 Tamiya in 1/24 scale and a Lamborghini that Zach did the engine work on....when he was 15!
