No Club Business to discuss this evening so a straight jump into Show N Tell.

John Cleveland brought in two beautifully done 1/24 Airfix kits. The first was a BF109 and its Battle of Britain counterpart the Spitfire MkI. Both done up in automotive paint as has been John's signature MO. Both of these builds were entered in our monthly theme: Adversaries

Zach Martin brought in a build we have seen before but is always worth a 2<sup>nd</sup> look.

A 1/48 Stuka on a base made out of a Russian T-34 as another entrant in our

Adversaries theme. Zach also had a Dragon 1/144 scale Bradley APC sitting on top of a 25mm shell casing done up beautifully! For the "purple" glass for the Bradleys periscopes Zach used purple colored film he found on a birthday crown at Walmart. Awesome!!!

Allen brought in a Warhammer "Plague" Marine, a Whizz kids kit and a D&D figurine. Allen also brought in a '57 Chevy drag car which he made his first attempt at a black finish. Allen said the decals gave him fits but he still managed to pull it off.

Rich brought in a Revell 1/48 F-18 originally the "Maverick" kit and turned it into a beautiful representation of a Blue Angels bird. All markings were stenciled and painted other than a few decals on the top of the build. Also on the table was an AMT F7F Tigercat wearing Navy Gloss Blue. "Tail heavy" shotgun pellets in the nose and a .25 shell casing in the centerline drop tank gives it enough weight to stand tall on the landing gear.

Paul W brought in a beautiful 1/48 Tamiya F-4B which he won in one of our raffles. Paul used MRP paints and instead of using the kit supplied decal for the upper spine of the plane he masked and painted it.

For his entry in the "Adversaries" theme Mark had a Y Wing fighter and Tie interceptor. Both were from the original MPC kits and done up very nicely!

Greg brought in two separate presentations for "Adversaries" The first set was a 1/72 Heller BF109F and a 1/72 P-40 by Hasegawa in desert camo. Followed up by two Corsairs from the "Soccer War" both in 1/72 scale, one an F4U4 and the other an F4U1.

Dave Horn had a magnificent display on a split base from Coastal Kits which included a 1/48 Wingsy BF109 and a Tamiya 1/48 Spitfire MkI. Both models were well represented on a great looking base!

Chris had a magnificent build he just completed recently called "Gramps enjoying retirement" Chris took a Gundam figure and 3d printed a set of Crocs, a walker, grill and cooler for his diorama. The ice in the cooler was chopped up clear sprue.

Great job!

John brought in a Revell X wing that he had to do a few modifications to make it "screen" correct. Opening up the wings into the right configuration. Also represented was a kitbash of a MPC/Revell Star Destroyer both of the builds represented for "Adversaries"

Keeping with the "Adversary" theme John brought in a diorama of a Velociraptor eating a hapless micro raptor and the Cylon Base ship and Galactica from the original series.

While Kurt didn't have any of his excellent work represented on the table he did have a new book to show from the Valiant Series on the JU88C-T (volume 2)

That's it for show n tell and our Adversaries theme. November will be "Beligerent Behemoths"! Large/oversized vessels, Star destroyer, Doomsday Machine, etc.
