Show N Tell:

Chris Fowler brought in a GWH SU27 in 1/48 scale he finished just before the meeting. It was done up in an amazing digital camo scheme and it truly something to see. Chris added some great aftermarket goodies with ResKit Nozzles, Quinta 3D Decals for the cockpit, AM landing gear from Details and Wonders and a great base from USA Diorama. Awesome job Chris!!!

Ron had a very nicely done Airfix 1/72 F4F-3 Wildcat painted with Hobby Barrel paint thinned with Windex. Ron did a really nice job on this build and it came out great!

Butch brought in couple of works in progress, the first, a 1/32 Fiesler Storch from Hasegawa. It has an upgraded interior with 3D decals from Quinta Studios and will hopefully be done for the August theme of "Sand Fleas" The other WIP is a 1/537 Star Trek Enterprise kit with a Decatur/Belknap class conversion kit.

Zach had definitely the "funnest" build on the tables with a Revell 1/32 Mig 29 done up in bright red, sporting NASCAR decals and a rubber chicken for a pilot. Dubbed "Mig Chicken" it was Zach's entry in this months theme "WTF" Oh, and the chicken makes noise when you squeeze it!

John Cleveland's contribution to tonights meeting was a fantastically done Revell 1/32 P-47D Razorback. An outstanding job with a less than great kit, John killed it with a ETO paint job using Tamiya paints.

Mark's entry tonight in the WTF category was a Hawk Kit of "Freddy The Flameout" A nostalgia kit of a big grinned, oversized pilot (think Animal from Sesame Street). Fun build!

Jerry brought in a Kitty Hawk F-86D Sabre which he said was quite the challenge to put together, had to tell based on how well Jerry did putting it together! Jerry used several different Alclad metal paints to get his NMF the way he wanted. Awesome work Jerry!

Casey brought in a couple of pieces to share. The first is a "Super Jerry" Maschinen Krieger which is a mostly OOB build but with some tubing added and upgraded from the kit supplied parts. The kit also came with a jig to make the metal handles for the kit. Next, which was Caseys entry for "WTF" were two finished MK fighting suites. While they have been on the table before they are always great to look at.

Mr. Kittinger brought in a 1/72 BV141 for the "WTF" theme. An interesting plane to look at the cockpit/fuselage is offset to one side of boom that houses the engine and tail plane. A limited built aircraft from WW2, definitely a WTF! This Airfix kit came with oversized rivets and raised panel lines, Greg sanded the surfaces smooth, re engraved the lines as well as added back the rivets to scale. The cockpit was scratchbuilt as the kit supplied was basically non existent. AK

Real colors brought the kit and Greg found a set of masks to take care of the canopy glass. Of course, its represented "In Flight"

Tonights winner for Model of the month was Chris's amazing SU-27 and Casey took home our WTF award with one of his great M&K builds.
