Chris also brought in a project he has been working on for a while. A Tamiya Mustang GT4 in Volt Racing colors. Chris mentioned it took him 4 tries to get the paint "right" and put the yellow primary over a white base. Beautiful job!!

Mark brought in a Dodge 1/24 PU he has been working on. Mark used steel wool to weather the truck and it has a nice rust patina on it. He also used the steel wool to dull the chrome pieces to give them an aged appearance. For tonights theme Mark brought in Snoopy riding his toon plane with a motorized engine. Nice work Mark!

Kurt's entry for the theme was a toon Spad with a full interior and opened up to show off the inner framework of the fuselage. To add some authenticity Kurt added tape seatbelts.

Dave Horn brought in a Hobby Boss 1/48 YF-23 Black Widow, fresh off the bench. Dave used BAM Models update set and Caracal decals to add realism to the build. Dave also brought in a 1/35 Kitty Hawk "Mego" helicopter as its main part is shape like an egg. A for trying Dave!
